

Things You Should Know Fiesta San Antonio 2026!

Established in 1891, Fiesta San Antonio is an 11-day festival celebrating the city's rich culture and diverse heritage. It features parades, carnivals, festive food and drinks, and various events, many of which donate proceeds to scholarships or charity. Fiesta is known for its large crowds and vibrant atmosphere.

Dress Comfortably



Generally acceptable to all events is vibrant, colorful, light and loose casual attire. Shorts, jeans, and dresses, or outdoor concert attire, are common. Weather will be humid in the mid-60's to high-80's throughout the week, with the chance of rain. Comfortable shoes are important, and tennis shoes are recommended. Lightweight layers would be best, with sunscreen, a hat, and sunglasses for the parade.

Bring the Essentials

For events, a small bag to carry a phone, wallet, sunglasses and other essentials is ideal. Clear bags and clutches that are 5.5" x 8.5" or smaller are recommended. Backpacks and bags larger than 10" x 10" are prohibited.

Remember to bring a valid ID for alcoholic drinks, if desired. Remember to bring a credit/debit card, as well as cash to avoid ATM fees. \$5 to \$20 bills recommended.

Most Fiesta events are cash only, commonly to exchange for food & drink tickets at events. Most food & drink items are between 5-10 tickets (\$) per item, so rule of thumb plan for 4 items (\$40), depending on your typical appetite, per event. Please research specific events in advance to confirm.
